- ◆ Yard waste pick up will end on December 13. Please have your yard waste in the brown yard bags or bundle sticks together no more than 4 feet long.

Sykesville Police Department

The Sykesville Police Department is looking for adult volunteers to fill the following roles within our Police Department:

School Crossing Guards

We are looking for mature adult residents of Sykesville who are interested in volunteering as a school crossing guard at Sykesville Middle School. We will provide you with the training and necessary equipment to safely perform this duty. The crossing detail will take approximately one-half hour in the morning and one-half hour in the afternoon, each day that school is in session.

Auxiliary Police Officers

The Sykesville Auxiliary Police shall perform the following duties under the direction of the Sykesville Police Department:

- Render assistance as requested in major disasters and emergencies as determined by the Chief of the Sykesville Police Department; and
- Render assistance as requested with regard to directing and controlling vehicular and pedestrian traffic and parking at such functions within the jurisdiction of the Sykesville Police Department; and
- Such other duties as may be directed by the Chief of Police.

Sykesville Auxiliary Police shall have the powers necessary to carry out the functions as directed by the Sykesville Police Department. Members of the Sykesville Auxiliary Police shall not be deemed police officers and shall not have general arrest and law enforcement powers, shall not carry or use firearms while on duty and shall not have general investigative responsibility.

Candidates for the Sykesville Auxiliary Police shall be recommended by the Chief of Police, approved and appointed by the Mayor and Town Council and must meet such criteria as may be established by the Chief of Police. Members of the Sykesville Auxiliary Police receive no compensation. Prior to exercising any duty as a member of the Sykesville Auxiliary Police, each auxiliary police officer shall take the oath of office similar to the oath taken by regular police officers.

The minimum qualifications for either of these volunteer civilian positions are:

- Must be at least 18 year of age,
- Be a graduate from an accredited high school or education equivalent to a high school diploma,
- Be a licensed driver in the State of Maryland,
- Must be able to pass a background investigation,
- Must be able to work under adverse weather conditions

If you feel that you meet the criteria for either of these positions and are interested in applying, go to our town website (www.townofsykesville.org) and download the Sykesville Police Auxiliary application (under Government, then Police Department), or you can stop by the Police Department and pick up an application. Please indicate on the application that you are interested in either the School Crossing Guard or Auxiliary Police position. The Sykesville Main Street Association was created in 2011. It is part of the Main Street Maryland Program. The program strives to strengthen the economic potential of Maryland's traditional main streets and neighborhoods. Main Street Maryland selects communities that have made a commitment to succeed and helps them improve the economy, appearance and image of their traditional downtown business districts through the Main Street five point approach for commercial revitalization, which is organized into the following committees: Design, Organization, Promotion, Economic Restructuring, and Green, Clean & Safe.

During its six years of operation, the Sykesville Main Street Association has accomplished so much for the residents of Sykesville, its visitors, and the merchant community: including the creation of the community garden, the development of the South Branch skate park, the restoration of the Main Street sign and the bike rack installation to the design and operation of a seven events yearly calendar; form the administration of State grants like Keep Maryland Beautiful, Downtown Lighting, Facade Improvement Program, and Nonprofit Assistance Fund that financed the Farmers Market, to the creation of the Shop Small Passports and Carroll Business Academy for local small businesses.

The Sykesville Main Street Association is thrilled to continue its journey as the **Downtown Sykesville Connection**, a stand-alone community non-profit striving to foster a vibrant downtown through economic development, promotion, design, and green initiatives.

The Historic Sykesville Colored Schoolhouse

Life is lively at the Historic Sykesville Colored Schoolhouse! It is most active every Monday and Wednesday afternoon when the school buses from Piney Ridge Elementary and Sykesville Middle discharge their students, who run down the hill for a healthy snack, tutoring, and enrichment activities sponsored by St. Paul's United Methodist Church. Second Tuesdays are also active since the Cattail River Garden Club has decided to make the Schoolhouse its regular meeting venue. On Friday, November 17, students from South Carroll High School came to the Schoolhouse to meet with Warren Dorsey and Rosie Dorsey Hutchinson. They had read Mr. Dorsey's biography, In Carrie's Footprints, and were thrilled to help him celebrate his 97 birthday, Denise Koch of WJZ13 did a wonderful piece on the event. And then there are the normal Open Houses for the Sykesville community, "O Christmas Tree" on December 2 and "Love, Lace, and Learning" on February 11, 2018.

While St. Paul's and the Sykesville-South Carroll Rotary Club fund the Homework Club's need for snacks, crafts, and learning materials, Wesley Freedom United Methodist Church has presented us with funds to purchase badly needed computers. Their "Caring Kids" group raised money for the Club at the Farmers' Market, which was matched by the church's Missions Committee. We are entering the Age of Technology!

Most exciting was the installation and dedication of a Little Free Library in front of the Schoolhouse on November 11. Girl Scout troop #2946, under the creative leadership of Amy Landry, spent over a year planning its library. They presented their concept to the Mayor and Town Council, the Historic District Commission, and the Maryland Historic Trust. Permissions in hand, they sought out donors for the necessary materials and under the guidance of engineer Dan Landry, built the cutest Little Free Library on the plan-

et! Each Girl Scout and each child in the Homework Club dipped a finger into paint to adorn the structure with colorful flowers and insects. One shelf of the Library is stuffed with children's books, while the other has reading materials for the adults in their lives. The idea is "take a book, read it, then return it or replace it with a different book." Now the Homework Club kids have a source of books every day of every week! Schoolhouse coordinator Pat Greenwald was humbled when the troop dedicated the Little Free Library to her. Each Scout was presented with a Bronze Award, the highest award girls of their age can receive.
