Summer Time in the Parks

By now we are all ready for some summer fun in the Parks. I wanted to give you a quick update on what is taking place within Sykesville and its Parks. Foremost, most park inquiries are about South Branch. If you don't know, the Town and Howard County came together to in 2011 to discuss the redevelopment of South Branch Park and particularly the Shrimp Town Skate Park, Pavil-



ion and Play Ground. Meeting with the Howard County Executive and Park officials, we were able to put together a comprehensive revitalization plan that was broad, inclusive and had all the stake holders involved. The Shrimp Town pioneers were running a renegade skate park with the Town's approval that was stretched numerous times beyond the actual approval. Their passion was second to none, and we all saw great things in them and all the kids and adults involved. We needed to get these kids a professional park they could be proud of that was both exciting and safe. The Town received a Community Parks & Playground Grant that built the Tot Lot, Howard County helped construct the Pavilion, and through much effort the new skate park. It was a great accomplishment and partnership that I have been most proud of as Mayor. These types of partnerships are rare, and we continue to try and build on it. A new 55-space parking lot is in the works, and we hope to see ground broken on that late this year. We have again been working with Howard County to complete that phase for some time. Next, we are trying to address the Old Apple Butter warehouse, and that will be quite an undertaking. We need professional engineering analysis, water and sewer hook ups and so much more as well. Most of the site lies in a flood plain which creates many challenges for redevelopment. Rest assured, we will continue to work together to revitalize that space. It will take time and a lot of creativity, but we continue to take small steps toward that goal. Things take time in Park Planning, and Howard County has many priority projects. I am grateful to their staff for all the help through the years. Patience and passion are hard to address at the same time, but we are mindful of both.

Keep in mind we have numerous other great Parks in Town as well. There are 12 parks in Town, including Millard Cooper Park, Burkett Park, Jones Park, Lexington Run Park, Warfield Park, and the Linear Trail. You can pick up complete Parks map at the Post Office Visitors Center and at the Town House.

The Sykesville Parks and Recreation Committee (SPARC) are a committed group of volunteers as well that continue to host great events all year long. Please try to attend and support the events, as it helps connect us all to our Parks and community as well as provide resources for the Parks.

Get out and enjoy our Parks, as they truly are a jewel in Small Town living not found in many communities. My gratitude goes out to all who help make them a success here in Sykesville.

Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste!

TRASH AND RECYCLING CHANGES 2018

- The following holidays will affect the trash and recycling changes.
- July 4, 2018: Trash normally picked up on July 4, 2018 will be picked up on July 6, 2018
- Thanksgiving, November 22, 2018: Recycling normally picked up on November 22, 2018 will be picked up on November 26, 2018. Recycling will be picked up normally on November 29, 2018
- Christmas Day, December 25, 2018: Trash and recycling pickup will be shifted by a day. Tuesday pickup will be on Wednesday, Wednesday pickup on Thursday, and recycling pickup on Friday.

YARD WASTE

- The Town will pick up yard waste on your regular trash day. It will occur after trash pick up
- Carroll County prohibits yard waste from being mixed with standard household refuse
- Yard waste pick up will begin on April 10, 2018 and will end on December 12, 2018
- Please have your yard waste in the brown yard bags or bundle sticks together no more than 4 feet long
- Yard waste must be placed in paper lawn bags
- Plastic bags will not be picked up
- Dumping of yard waste in the parks and other wooded areas in the Town or along the Linear Trail is prohibited

DOGGIE BAG STATIONS NOW AVAILABLE FOR USE!

The Public Works Department installed new doggie bag stations in Millard Cooper Park and along the Linear Trail. Please clean up after your pets to keep our parks clean and safe for everyone to use!



VEGETATION AND TREE TRIMMING

Property owners must keep trees which overhang a road at least 13.5 feet above the road and trees which overhang a sidewalk at least 10 feet above the sidewalk. A full copy of the vegetation ordinance is available at townofsykesville.org.

- Trim all vegetation and growth around stop signs
- Trim all trees overhanging a road to at least 13.5 feet
- Trim all trees overhanging a sidewalk to at least 10 feet




- Keep your grass trimmed to less than 12 inches
- Don't put grass trimmings in the street

STORM DRAINS

- Prevent grass clippings and leave from getting in the storm drains
- The clippings will break down in the storm drains and the nutrients released can be harmful to the water quality
- Clippings can also clog drains, causing flooding and storm drain failure

Hello folks,

We're going to try something new this summer. Right now we're calling it "porch talks." Beginning this July and going into October, hopefully every other Sunday at 2, we'll be having guests out on the Gate House porch giving free talks on items of local historic interest. So far we've lined up seven speakers and expect to have eight to ten.

Topics will include the great flood that washed away Sykesville in 1868; working at Springfield during the seventies through the nineties; the Strawbridge Home for Boys; the B & O railroad and Sykesville; the Old Colored Schoolhouse and life up Oklahoma Hill between 1920 and 1950; Frank Brown, the Brown's cottages, and the Gothic mansion up the hill; World War I and Sykesville 100 years ago. Many others are under consideration.

There will be chairs and refreshments and a chance to sit around and talk to the speakers and each other once each talk is over.


