Warfield

n January 24th, Warfield Investments, LLC formally submitted their petition for a text amendment to the Planned Employment Center (PEC) zoning district. That's a fancy way of saying that they have asked the Town to consider changing the existing rules that dictate what can be done on properties having this zoning designation including the property in Warfield and the historic buildings. The Town Council referred this petition to the Planning Commission (PC) and is currently awaiting their recommendation. Upon receipt of their recommendation, we will schedule a public hearing and advertise it accordingly.

We are being asked to approve an amendment to the PEC district that will increase the maximum residential density from 2 units per acre to 6.5 units per acre. The total property in Town zoned PEC is roughly 120 acres—inclusive of the Warfield property and an adjacent undeveloped property—meaning the allowable residential permitted in the PEC district would increase from 240 to 780 units with the estimated population increase climbing from 576 to 1,872 (based upon an accepted average of 2.4 persons per residential unit).

It is of utmost importance to me and the Town Council that we include public opinion in our decision making process so we know that we are acting in your best interest. The only way to do this is to hear from you—every single one of you. This is not the first time I've asked you to show up. I am depending on you to show up again. In 1981 some of the townspeople wanted to do away with Sykesville's Charter, thereby allowing her to be absorbed into the County. If not for a mayor and three town council members then, there'd be no mayor now imploring you to have your say. There'd be no town. Be a part of this decision. We're listening.

Sykesville Police Department

I'm pleased to report that we are well on our way to a fully staffed police department. I am excited to report that on April 1st, our first female recruit graduates from the Carroll County Sheriff's Office police academy. She will fill the vacancy created when an officer resigned last year. Chief Spaulding has identified two new recruits who just late last month began their training at the Maryland Police and Correctional Training Commissions police academy with plans for them to fill two new positions. We are also looking to add a certified officer from another department, who would be available prior to the new cadets' graduation. If all goes well, we will soon boast a robust force of ten sworn officers and an unprecedented opportunity to offer 24/7 service. A fully staffed department assures two officers on shift at all times and offers not only improved safety for Sykesville residents, but also to the men and women serving our Department.

For any new residents, please consider joining our Nixle Emergency Alerting and Notification System. These may include public safety threats, dangerous weather conditions, and traffic advisories. Information is key, and we strongly encourage you to sign up to receive text message alerts directly from the Sykesville Police Department. Simply text your zip code (21784) to 888777 and you'll be informed and instructed when necessary.

We are currently seeking volunteers for our Police Auxiliary Unit and School Crossing Guard Unit. We are looking for mature adult volunteers who wish to contribute toward making our town safer for all to enjoy. Infrastructure

Just a reminder about the projects planned for Main Street and Springfield Avenue. Before work commences this spring, the County is presenting to the Town Council on March 28th a summary of the scope of work, their expected timetable and their process for communicating with residents whose services will be temporarily impacted by the work. Feel free to attend the meeting in person or watch the live stream on the Town's FB page or Carroll Media Center's YouTube channel.

Unrelated to the aforementioned project, we are working with SHA to achieve a safe pedestrian walkway on the bridge and connecting South Branch Park to Main Street. Secretary Porter of the Maryland Department of Transportation has offered his endorsement of the project and has committed our SHA District Engineer and her staff to working with the Town to see it into fruition. We are currently in the conceptual engineering phase of the project. SHA will be improving West Friendship Road (the most southern portion of MD 851) and the Patapsco River Bridge in the anticipatable future. Upon completion, the State is to turn the road over to Howard County. Ideally, the Town, Howard County and SHA will coordinate our efforts and investments to create a welcoming and safe gateway to Sykesville—connecting downtown to current and future amenities in South Branch Park including the newly installed parking lot that will also serve as a trail head for ongoing establishment of the Patapsco Regional Greenway. Our overarching concept for bridge improvements includes partnering with Carroll County for the provision of water and sewer to the "Apple Butter Warehouse," in South Branch Park.

Gate House Museum



he Gate House recently welcomed the first of this year's student interns, Jolie Feltz of Liberty High School. Ms. Feltz's major project consists of creating a temporary exhibit on Jones Sisters' artwork. In order to interpret this art, her internship includes everything from public history to video editing to art theory. Expect to see the exhibit she creates sometime in April.

We are taking adult (all ages) and student (grade 7-12 and college) volunteers this spring for a variety of projects including

assisting at outreach events, leading informal tours of the house and nearby grounds, indexing The Sykesville Herald newspaper, and scanning and indexing our vertical files as we work to increase access to our collection.

This summer, the Gate House plans to host two sessions of history day camp featuring a Regency/War of 1812 general time period theme. Campers will learn about the history of Sykesville from Post-revolutionary times through just before the coming of the railroad (1831). Centering on the history of the Patterson Family, campers will engage in historical crafts, activities and trades, learn about local agriculture and foodways, and of course take advantage of our proximity to Millard Cooper Park and its new splash pad and playground. If you are interested in helping organize, donating snacks, prepping craft materials, hemming costumes, or demonstrating a historical skill or trade, please contact the curator at gatehouse@sykesville.net. Details and applications for camp can be picked up in person at the Gate House after March 15.

This spring, our volunteers switched out all the artifacts in the parlor room and placed new photographs on display. We expect installation of all new interpretive signage in the parlor before the end of spring. Our World War I era exhibit will be phased out through the course of this year, so be sure to come see it before you miss it!
