### 2023 SYKESVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT JUNIOR CSI ACADEMY

The Sykesville Police Department is proud to announce that the 14<sup>th</sup> Annual Junior CSI Academy will be returning this year on Saturday, September 16, 2023. Once again, this year's program will be held outdoors at the Millard Cooper Park here in town. The program starts at 9:30 am and concludes with graduation and a certificate ceremony at 2:30 pm. Parents are welcome to attend the graduation at 2:30, but we are asking that parents not stay for the entire day. We will have additional staff to monitor and supervise the students throughout the day. This program is geared toward middle school students, so we would ask that you only register those children who are within that age group. This program is once again generously supported by the Freedom District Lion's Club Youth Outreach program.

The academy will once again be led by Sykesville Chief of Police Michael Spaulding, with assistance from Sergeant Padraic Lacy, Sykesville Police Department, Detective Earl Kratsch, a retired homicide investigator from Baltimore Police Department, and CSI Supervisor Brittaney Soto of the Carroll County Sheriff's Office. Students will be exposed to the various aspects of crime scene investigations during the one-day course. They will have the opportunity to learn about collecting latent fingerprints, performing grid searches, the use of canine dogs in locating evidence, and the importance of properly marking, photographing and collecting evidence, as well as maintaining the integrity of a crime scene.

The instructors are from nearby agencies such as the Maryland State Police, the Carroll County Sheriff's Office, the Sykesville Police Department and the Baltimore City and County Police Departments, and all are experts in crime-scene investigations.

### **GRASS TRIMMING**

- Remember to keep your grass trimmed to less than 12 inches
- Do not put grass trimmings in the street

### STORM DRAINS

Grass clippings and yard waste that gets into storm drains causes many problems. The clippings will break down in the storm drains and the nutrients released can be harmful to the water quality. The clippings can also clog the drains, potentially causing storm drain failure and flooding.

### YARD WASTE

- The Town will pick up yard waste on your regular trash day. It will occur after trash pick up
- Carroll County prohibits yard waste from being mixed with standard household refuse
- Please have your yard waste in the brown yard bags or bundle sticks together no more than 4 feet long
- Yard waste must be placed in paper lawn bags
- Plastic bags will not be picked up
- Dumping of yard waste in the parks and other wooded areas in the Town or along the Linear Trail is prohibited
