The Sykesville Police Department is proud to announce that the 16th Annual Junior CSI Academy will be returning this year on <u>Saturday, September 13, 2025</u>. Once again, this year's program will be held outdoors at the Millard Cooper Park here in town. The program starts at 9:30 am and concludes with graduation and a certificate ceremony at 2:30 pm. Parents are welcome to attend the graduation at 2:30, but we are asking that parents not stay for the entire day. We will have additional staff to monitor and supervise the students throughout the day. This program is geared toward middle school students, so we would ask that you only register those children who are within that age group. This program is once again generously supported by the Freedom District Lion's Club Youth Outreach program.

The academy will once again be led by Sykesville Chief of Police Michael Spaulding, with assistance from Sergeant Padraic Lacy, Sykesville Police Department, and CSI Supervisor Brittaney Soto of the Carroll County Sheriff's Office. Students will be exposed to the various aspects of crime scene investigations during the one-day course. They will have the opportunity to learn about collecting latent fingerprints, performing grid searches, the use of canine dogs in locating evidence, and the importance of properly marking, photographing and collecting evidence, as well as maintaining the integrity of a crime scene.

The instructors are from nearby agencies such as the Maryland State Police, the Carroll County Sheriff's Office, the Sykesville Police Department and the Baltimore City and County Police Departments, and all are experts in crime-scene investigations.

Applications can be obtained in person at the Police Department, Sykesville Middle School, or on-line at https://www.sykesvillepolice.org/. 
Gate House Museum

The Gate House continues to hold our regular hours with free admission to all this summer: Tuesday: 10-4 | Friday: 10-4 | Sunday 12-5

Friday, July 18, pop into the Gate House for our Christmas in July open house! 1950s and early 1900s holiday displays will make an early appearance this year, and will be on view the entire month of July. Help us kickoff this celebration on Friday, July 11 with extended hours from 10-6.

You will see in this issue of the newsletter advertisements for a series of open houses at the Historic Colored Schoolhouse (518 Schoolhouse Road) on select Saturdays from 12-2. We held the first event on Juneteenth (observed) focusing on recent research undertaken in conjunction with the Downtown Sykesville Connection's JEDI committee to explore the history of the black community along Oklahoma Road. At this event, guests from the county genealogical society helped provide research, resources, and advice about exploring your past. There is no charge for these events, and event parking will be marked along Schoolhouse Road during event hours. The Schoolhouse site itself is accessible and has a modern bathroom.

These short open houses at the schoolhouse are designed to help evaluate post-COVID interest in the site and how we might be able to open the schoolhouse without appointments on a more regular basis. If you cannot attend these dates, please reach out to the Gate House to discuss your ideas for times, programming, guest speakers, etc. and stay tuned to our facebook events page for upcoming programs there (Spring 2026), as well as special Gate House hours and events.


