- Our curators have met with Theresa Worden of the Maryland Humanities Council at the Farm Museum. The Smithsonian is putting on a traveling exhibit. It will travel to 5 sites around the state in 2017. There are 7 applicants, and there will be 5 winners. If the farm museum is one of the winners, our Gate House Museum will be part of the program which will be good for exposure.

- Volunteer recruitment is now a focus.
